



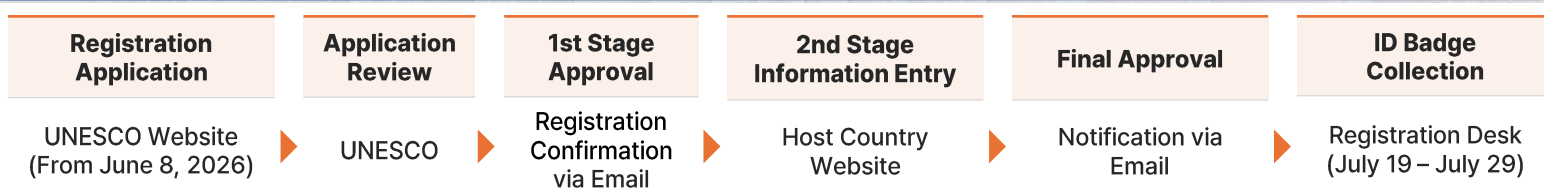
The 48th Session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee

MEDIA REGISTRATION INFORMATION

I OVERVIEW

- All media representatives must complete the media pre-registration process to cover the 48th Session of the World Heritage Committee.
- The media registration application and approval process is conducted in two stages via the official UNESCO and Host Country websites. An ID Badge for venue access will be issued based on the personal information provided.
- Wear your ID Badge at all times for venue access and security checks.

II PROCESS



I Media Registration Application (June 8 – July 29)

- Media registration must be processed on an individual basis, and on-site registration is strictly prohibited.
- All media representatives wishing to register must submit their applications via the link provided in the media invitation (refer to the QR code on the right)

- UNESCO will review the submitted application documents to determine registration approval. Approved applicants will receive the 2nd stage registration link and password via the email address provided in their application.



II 2nd Stage Information Entry (June 8 – July 29)

- Upon completing the submission of your details, including a photo and personal information, on the Host Country website, an official registration confirmation will be sent via email.
- Please note that venue access is strictly limited to those who have completed the registration process. Therefore, we strongly advise completing your registration prior to July 19, 2026.
- Applicants requiring visa issuance are encouraged to complete their Step 2 registration by July 3, 2026, to facilitate visa and fee waiver procedures. Registrations submitted after July 3 will still be processed, but the related procedures may take longer or cause some inconvenience.

III ID Badge Collection and Media Support (July 19 – July 29)

- Approved media representatives may collect their ID badges at the on-site registration desk by presenting a valid personal ID and their registration confirmation email.

(Reference 1) Required Documents for Registration

1) Letter of Assignment

- A digital copy of the letter of assignment written in English(Certificate of employment and employee ID card will not be accepted.)
- The document must bear the affiliated organization's logo, the personal signature (or official seal) of the person in charge, and the contact information of the headquarters.
- It must explicitly state the identity and official position of the registration applicant.
- A single accreditation letter may include a group roster (however, each registrant must upload the document individually).
- For foreign media correspondents based in Seoul, an accreditation letter issued under the name of the Seoul Bureau Chief is also acceptable.
* The Bureau Chief themselves must submit an accreditation letter issued directly by their headquarters.
- The file must be in JPG, PNG, or PDF format.

2) ID Badge Photo

- Access to the venue for the 48th Session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee is strictly managed through a secure access control system and personalized ID badges. For security purposes, your access to the venue may be restricted if the registered photo does not meet the required standards. Therefore, please ensure that the photo submitted during registration complies with the conditions outlined below.
- A photograph taken within the last 6 months.
- A color photograph in JPG format (JPEG, BMP, or PDF files are not accepted).
- Minimum resolution of 480x640 pixels, maximum of 960x1280 pixels.
- File size must be 5MB or less.
- Scanned images of identification cards are strictly prohibited.
- The length of the face (from the crown of the head to the chin) must account for at least 70% of the total photograph length.
